Car Parking

We are blessed with an abundance of car park spaces at SFX, however, would like to remind families of the information below. <u>Could</u> you also please ensure that this information is shared with others who transport your child/ren to and from school.

Park Lake Drive Carpark and Kiss & Drop Zone

- When entering the Kiss & Drop zone, *please move to the farthest available bay*. Whilst we understand it is ideal if you get the park with the shade, please remember that *children are not dismissed until 3.15pm* and therefore, if you arrive early (some arrive as early as 2.30pm), you will have quite a wait in the parking bay.
- As cars leave the Kiss & Drop bays, please ensure that you move your car down to the next available position.
- The Kiss & Drop is designed for families transporting children to/from school to remain in the car. If you intend on leaving the car to collect children from the gate or from their classrooms, please use the carparks, not the Kiss & Drop bays.
- Please be aware of *Council signage in relation to no standing areas*. There have been a number of complaints from both our own families and neighbours in relation to cars queueing (standing) on Park Lake Drive as well as around the corner onto Carignane Street. Visibility for cars attempting to drive and turn onto the road(s) is severly hampered. *Council Parking Inspectors and SA Police* will be monitoring this situation, *and fines may be issued where rules are not adhered to*.

• Children are not dismissed until 3.15pm, and staff are on duty at the gate until 3.35pm. *3.25pm to 3.35pm has been identified as the easiest time for collection*.

Back Gate Collection

Complaints have also been received from our own families and neighbours in relation to cars parking on properties, footpaths etc near the back gate. *Council Parking Inspectors and SA Police will be monitoring this situation, and fines may be issued where rules are not adhered to*.

Please remember that we are all role models for the students at SFX, and common courtesy and manners should be used at all times.

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is the day following Pancake 'Shrove' Tuesday and was celebrated on 17th February.

Ash Wednesday is the first of 40 days of Lent. This is to symbolise the 40 day period of fasting and prayer Jesus served in the desert before his execution by Pontius Pilot.

As Christians we are encouraged to make a commitment to prayer, charity and fasting or self-denial during this period. Many Catholics make Lenten promises or resolutions to mark the importance of this holy season.

Each class gathered for an Ash Wednesday Liturgy to mark the beginning of Lent. Students received the ashes on their foreheads, symbolising repentance and the willingness to change for the better.

The library has been a hub of activity already this year with lots of very keen readers enjoying our wonderful space. While COVID prevented us from hosting various planned activities last year, we are hoping that we will be able to bring the students a few more events to enjoy in 2021.

Students and their families are welcome to come and visit us from 8.30am each morning or until 4.00pm each afternoon. Students are also welcome to come in for quiet activities during their lunch break from Monday to Thursday.

Overdue / Lost / Damaged Library Books

Unfortunately we continue to have an issue with overdue, lost and damaged books. Please note that student loans are for 14 days and books need to be returned to the library within that time. Students may extend the loan for an additional 14 days, however, they must bring the book(s) into the library and ask a staff member for a loan extension.

Should you receive an email from the library advising that your child has overdue books, could you please ensure that they return them to the library as a matter of urgency. Should they fail to be returned after reminders have been sent, an invoice may be sent home requesting payment to replace the books. If the books are subsequently found, please return them as soon as possible. An invoice may also be issued where a student returns a library book that is damaged beyond repair.

All students are reminded about overdue books when they come to the library. Going forward, Years 4, 5 and 6 students will also be included (via their SFX student email address) on the overdue notices that are emailed to parents/caregivers. We hope, with support from families, that this will encourage students to take ownership of their loans.

Please note, students who have overdue books cannot borrow until the books have been returned or invoice for lost books has been settled.

Premier's Reading Challenge

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is a literacy engagement program that was introduced to encourage a love of reading and to improve literacy skills. The Challenge has now commenced for 2021 and students should have received a PRC reading record form from their class teacher. If they have not received one as yet or would like another copy, they can collect from the library.

A couple of things to note ...

- Last year's eased guidelines as a result of COVID restrictions are no longer valid, therefore, the regular guidelines will need to be followed.
- PRC sticker colours the students should be looking for are Reception to Year 2 Orange; Year 3 5 Green; Year 6 Yellow.
- To complete the Challenge, students are required to read 8 x PRC books of their level and 4 x other books of their own choice. If the 4 free choice books also happen to be PRC books, then they can add these to the free choice section of their Student Reading Record.
- If students wish to read books above their level then they are most welcome to do so and can include those books on their Student Reading Record, however, reading below is discouraged depending on the reading ability of the student.
- If one book in a series is on the PRC book list, then all other books in that series are also considered PRC books. However, students can only enter a maximum of 3 books from the same series and/or author on their Student Reading Record.
- While library staff do what we can to ensure we display relevant coloured stickers on each of the books, this list changes regularly so some may fall through the cracks. The PRC website provides a list of the books included in the challenge. This is a public site so anyone can access it, however, students are welcome to ask library staff to check the list for them: https://premiersreadingchallenge.sa.edu.au/
- We are again encouraging healthy competition between classrooms and year levels with the return of the very popular class party for the first class to complete the challenge, and a prize for the first entire year level finish.

• While all staff strongly encourage students to complete the challenge and we offer incentives and a bit of friendly competition between classes to make it more fun, the onus is on the students (with the assistance and support of parents/caregivers) to complete and return the forms to the library before the closing date.

We are hoping that you will join us in attempting to reach our goal of 100% completion by encouraging your child to enter the details of the books as they read them. Once complete, the form must be returned to the library or their class teacher. Students have until Friday, 3rd September, 2021 to complete their reading and to hand in their forms. Certificates and medals will be awarded in November.


